We are pleased to inform you that as part of the Police Education Program, Year 7 students will participate in an important educational session focused on Antisocial Behaviour (ASB). This session will run for one hour on Tuesday 11 March, with an aim to raise awareness about the impact of antisocial behaviour on individuals and the community, as well as the consequences for those involved.

During the session, students will cover the following key topics:

- **Understanding Antisocial Behaviour:** Students will learn what antisocial behaviour is, how it negatively affects both victims and the wider community, and why it is a serious issue.
- **Consequences of Antisocial Behaviour:** Students will explore the legal and social consequences for individuals who engage in antisocial behaviour, including how it can impact their future opportunities and plans.
- **Support and Reporting:** Students will be informed about where they can seek help if they are victims of antisocial behaviour, as well as the appropriate steps to take if they witness or experience such behaviour.


